Public and private investment in renewable energy is expected to accelerate fostered by the growing emphasis on climate change mitigation, the use of energy infrastructure to support economic growth, and the need to promote energy independence and security. Countries worldwide have introduced support schemes, such as incentives and subsidies, to promote both public and private infrastructure projects in renewal energy. Such projects entail varying degrees of risks for both the public and private sector, depending on the national governance environment in which they operate.

Drawing from international experience, the webinar aims to present and discuss a comprehensive framework to assist ministries of finance in identifying and quantifying fiscal costs and risks arising from these support schemes, as well as developing measures to mitigate them.
